

ARTICLE II Gage Brook Recreation Center and Park [Adopted 4-19-1999 by L.L. No. 10-1999]

§ 148-14. Legislative intent.

The purpose of this article is to ensure the safety, comfort and convenience of the public in their appropriate uses of Gage Brook Recreation Center and Park.

§ 148-15. Domestic animals prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any person to bring or otherwise possess any domestic animal, leashed or otherwise, within the area designated as Gage Brook Recreation Center and Park.

§ 148-16. Performances prohibited except by permit.

It shall be unlawful to conduct performances of any nature whatsoever, including but not limited to concerts, dramas, shows, parades, drills, reviews, speeches and playing of musical instruments, within Gage Brook Recreation Center and Park, without making application for same and receiving permission on a form, approved by the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Lake George known as a "community facilities use permit."

§ 148-17. Occupation of park prohibited during certain hours.

It shall be unlawful to occupy Gage Brook Recreation Center and Park between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m.

§ 148-18. Alcoholic beverages prohibited.

The possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages of any type is prohibited within the Park except as permitted by special use permit by the Lake George Village Board of Trustees.

§ 148-19. Skating rink.

- A. Free open skating will be limited to 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- B. Ice hockey may be permitted from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.
- C. All participants must be properly equipped with skates and other personal protection devices.

§ 148-20. Tubing hills.

- A. Tubing will be permitted only within areas designated by signage.
- B. No one over six years of age will be permitted on the children's area unless

accompanying a child. Only flexible plastic sleds and tubes will be permitted.

- C. Only tubes will be permitted on the adult tubing hill.
- D. There shall be no linking tubes together.
- E. Village security personnel reserve the right to open or close areas as necessary. They reserve the right to prohibit or restrict use by individuals or the use of devices.

§ 148-21. Penalties for offenses. [Amended 5-15-2000 by L.L. No. 2-2000]

- A. Every violation of this chapter shall constitute an offense, as defined by § 10.00 of the Penal Law of the State of New York and shall be punishable by a fine of not more than \$100.
- B. In addition to any other remedies or penalties that may be imposed, a violation of this chapter shall entitle the Board of Trustees to undertake a remedy to repair any damage caused by the violation of any section or provision of this chapter, and the actual disbursements and expenses therefor shall be added to the fine(s) set forth in this chapter. This provision shall be in addition to any other provisions, penalties or powers available to the Village for enforcement of this chapter.
